## *Father Sam's Message*

In this week's Gospel, our Lord Jesus reminds us, *"For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."* Jesus tells us to first take the *"lowest place"* when invited to *"a wedding banquet."* A wedding banquet arouses thoughts of joy and communion with others. In Scriptures, the image of a wedding feast is used to describe in human terms the overwhelming experience of being in the presence of God in heaven. Jesus reminds us in this Gospel just as there are human expectations and protocols of how to behave, including in one of His other parables even what we are to wear at an important event like a wedding banquet, there are also expectations of how we are to respond to God's invitation to His banquet. The first of these expectations is the virtue of humility, knowing we are not deserving on our own merits of reclining at His table. It is only by His gracious Love and Mercy we are able to be with Him at the *"wedding feast of the Lamb."* The next expectation is we are prepared to participate in the heavenly festivities signified by being dressed in the proper garment.

The Eucharist, the celebration of the Mass, is truly the foretaste of the indescribable beauty, joy, and peace of the heavenly wedding banquet. In approaching Jesus in Holy Communion, we should not assume a *"place of honor"* by thinking of ourselves as deserving or having *"the right"* to receive our Lord's sacred Body and Blood. Rather, we should *"take the lowest place"* by acknowledging we are not worthy when approaching our God, the Creator of all things. However, we should not do this self-assessment of our unworthiness in a way that we belittle or denigrate ourselves. On the contrary, we look at ourselves tenderly and honestly, seeing ourselves as little children before God, accepting we are *"the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind"* who God, in His Mercy, invites to the banquet of His Son's Body and Blood. Humbling ourselves before God, taking *"the lowest place"* at the Heavenly table, is done by preparing to receive Holy Communion with sincere, intentional, and focused prayer. Also, we make sure we are always dressed in the pure wedding garment washed in the Blood of the Lamb we received at our baptism. This means we come to receive Jesus free from the stain of sin, especially serious sin. We always recognize it is only by His grace we can receive Him worthily and only by His Word we are healed. In approaching Jesus in the Eucharist reverently, devoutly, and humbly, we then will be invited by God, our Host, to *"move up to a higher*

*place"* in spite of our lowliness and sin.

Through the intercession of the Blessed Mother and our Patron St. Patrick, let us ask God for the grace needed to humbly respond to His invitation to participate in His heavenly banquet of the Eucharist.

### *Update on the Front Entrance Project*

Our new front entrance to the Church is nearly done. We are hoping to have all the metal handrails and guardrails installed by the end of this upcoming week, Friday, September 6<sup>th</sup>. If all goes according to plan, we will return to having our celebration of Mass in the Church on the weekend of September 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>.

We are all very excited to see how this phase of the project turns out. In addition to being much easier to enter the Church, the design of the custom guard railing, which includes images of shamrocks and crosses in the top area of the guardrail and three unique historic and spiritual scenes cut into metal plates inset in the six sections of the railing, along with six small brick pillars matching the brick pillars on the Church building, will enhance the beauty of the entrance area.

Once we are able to celebrate Masses in the Church, work still will need to be done to finally replace the front doors. To keep the project moving forward, we are now planning to have the old doors removed, including the door frame and stained glass window, this upcoming week. The doors and frame need to be removed to get the most accurate measurements for the new doors and frame set. But this approach will leave the vestibule (the area just inside the church) exposed. The area will remain open while we wait for the new doors and new frame to be made locally. We have been told it will take four weeks. In the meantime, because we will not have front doors on the church, the two inner doors (the ones from the vestibule to the main body of the Church) will become the outside doors. This is probably not going to look too pretty, but it seems to be the most efficient and quickest way to get the doors replaced while, at the same time, getting us back into the Church. So I ask for your continued patience and please *"pardon our dust."* I sincerely feel all this will be well worth it, both practically and aesthetically.

However, we will need to raise more money with future fundraisers, including possibly using the wood of the old doors to build small crosses / crucifixes that may be "purchased" for a donation. 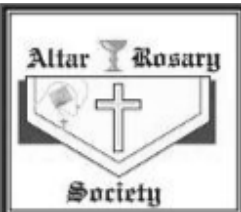
#### *Parish Picnic*

## Parish Services

Every month, on the first full weekend of each month, we ask you to donate to Parish Services, and our ushers stand outside after Mass with special baskets to collect your spare change (or dollar bills!)

Here is where those donations go:

Deacon Mike and seven other volunteers form the committee for St. Patrick's Parish Services, and are the stewards of your generous monthly donations. They monitor the requests for help on a case by case basis. Help with rent, utilities, and lodging are the main requests each month. While the primary focus is St. Patrick's parishioners, some emergency help is also extended to community members who are not parishioners. Unfortunately, it is not possible to fully fund every request, so the Parish Services committee must decide the best way to use our parishioners' generous donations. In any given quarter we average \$400-500 in assistance with utilities, \$800-900 for housing, \$300-400 for transportation and \$700-800 in general assistance. Everyone who benefits from our Parish Services program always extends a heartfelt "Thank you!" to everyone at St. Patrick's Parish for their generosity. Thank you for your continued support!

### Religious Education at St. Patrick's

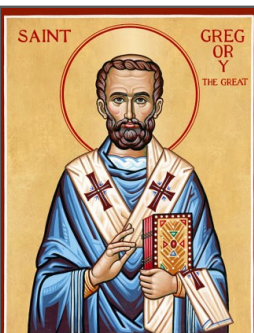
The necessity of passing on our faith is ever so important during these days when society's focus is mainly to honor self, rather than honor the God who created us.

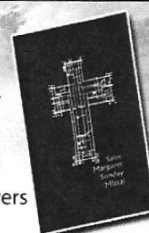
